
A retro Showa-era dining street. Perfect for lunch after enjoying the Sky Garden!

Even if you get lost, you can enjoy delicious izakayas, cafés, and shopping along the way. It's easy to reach the landmarks of Umeda, so make sure to conquer the "Umeda Dungeon"!



Namba Fun Facts

The name "Namba" comes from "Naniwa Palace," Japan's capital 1,350 years ago. The ruins are still visible today, perfect for history buffs!

The famous Glico sign in Dotonbori changes occasionally, and its background switches daily, featuring locations from around Japan and the world. If you catch it, be sure to take a photo!








It means 'Thank you'! Saying it after paying at a shop will make them happy!
